

## Boylan Bites

This month's recipe comes from Emily Brinker; her go to dessert is quick and easy, and sounds delicious!

**Easy Cobbler** – works with any fresh fruit.

1. Fill a 9x9 baking dish with any fresh fruit: Peel and chop peaches or apples. Toss blackberries or blueberries whole.
2. Melt 6 Tbsp of butter in a saucepan.
3. Stir in 1 cup of sugar (I like to do half brown sugar and half white sugar,) 1 cup of all purpose flour, 1 beaten egg and a pinch of salt.
4. Spread topping over fruit and bake at 375 until fruit bubbles around the side and topping is lightly browned.
